PROFESSIONAL BACKGROUND

Admitted to practice law in Oregon, 1958; admitted to practice also in U. S. District Court for Oregon, U. S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, U. S. Supreme Court and U. S. Court of Federal Claims; law clerk to Justice Hall S. Lusk, Supreme Court of Oregon, 1958–1959; associated in private practice since 1959 with present firm, and partner in firm since January 1, 1964; served as volunteer civil rights lawyer in Mississippi, February–March, 1966.

Member of Oregon State Bar (President, 1976–1977 and Member of Board of Governors 1974–1977), Multnomah Bar Association, American Bar Association, Maritime Law Association of the United States; adjunct professor of law, Northwestern School of Law of Lewis & Clark College, teaching course in admiralty law (1969 to date) and arbitration law (2002–2007); service as arbitrator and mediator, primarily in controversies involving construction and commercial law, through American Arbitration Association, and Arbitration Service of Portland; served as the neutral arbitrator in \$20 million claim for cost overrun in construction of tank vessel (*FMC Corp. v. Chevron Shipping Co.*), involving over one year of hearings which began in December, 1976, with award rendered in March, 1978; co–editor of 1987 Oregon State Bar CLE Handbook on Arbitration and Dispute Resolution, and supplements through 2008.

Nature of law practice has been general, principally in various stages of counseling, preparing and trial of state and federal cases, and handling of appeals before state and federal appellate courts, including two cases briefed and argued in U. S. Supreme Court: *Lloyd Corp. v. Tanner*, 407 U.S. 551 (1972), and *Walsh v. Schlecht*, 429 U.S. 401 (1977).
